Road Safety Course in Delft University of Technology

MISSION

Delft Road Safety Courses (DRSC) is a cooperation between Delft University of Technology, SWOV Institute for Road Safety Research, Delft Post Graduate Education and Road Safety for All. The objective of DRSC is capacity building for road safety professionals in low and middle income countries by transferring knowledge on effective road safety strategies, action plans and projects. The annual Road Safety Course in Delft is one of the core activities, besides on line learning, organizing similar courses abroad and supporting training and research programmes in LMIC. FIA Foundation is supporting DRSC.

Fees, scholarships and registration

COURSE

This two weeks course is targeted at road safety professionals from LMIC who are or will be active in road safety for some time during their professional career. More details of the criteria for admittance may be found at the reverse "Who should attend?".

The course fee amounts to € 5100,-.

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IMPROVING ROAD SAFETY IN LMIC's IS FEASIBLE

In many low and middle-income countries (LMIC) the number of road traffic fatalities and serious injuries are high with mortality rates up to ten times higher than the best performing countries.

Since the United Nations Decade of Action for Road Safety and the recent acceptance of the UN Sustainable Development Goals, in which road safety is included, the political priorities have been clearly set. Now it will come down to design the cost-effective national strategies and implement action plans. The Road Safety Course in Delft aims to present to you the vast knowledge and expertise underpinning strategies and action plans. Our course leader professor Fred Wegman and the lecturers are recruited from the world's leading experts on road safety. They will provide you with the latest state of art

WHO SHOULD ATTEND?

Participants may have a background in engineering, health, social sciences etc. They may work for central or regional public authorities, for international organizations, in the private sector, as a consultant, at universities, research institutes, police or NGO's, etc. Thus students at universities will not be admitted.

Those who are interested in participating are invited to submit a motivation letter. The course leader will decide on admittance to the course based on the following criteria:

- Academic or higher professional education, preferably master degree, with relevance for road safety
- Strong position in road safety policy and/or research, preferably at a regular permanent post
- Mastering the English language
- Motivation shown in the motivation letter

In addition we put a limit on the number of participants from a country (max 2 or 3).

CONTENT

Participants will learn to develop a Road Safety Plan and to set up local programmes. All lectures, discussions and course materials will be in English. The final programme 2016 will be published on our site.

COURSE SETTINGS

The course includes class room presentations, facilitated discussions, group work and field trips. An active participation will be stimulated and all participants will have ample opportunity for questions, group discussions and informal discussions. All participants will be invited to make one or two presentations to the whole group. To allow for an (inter)active and intensive learning process, the course can host a maximum of 25 participants only. Participants will receive a certificate after completing the full course.
